Daily Spark #28

Romans 8:31 "What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us?"

Two weeks ago we talked about how God views His people, last week we talked about God's creation for His people and today we see that if God is for us, no one can stand against us. What we should start seeing is that God's plan has always been about His people. God wanted His people to enjoy His creation. He has never had any evil thoughts about His people and has a future of hope and prosperity planned for them. And now Paul shares some insight with the Roman church about just how powerful God really is and exactly whose side He is on.

The Roman church had many problems. The Jews had been run out of Rome and so the Gentiles took over the church. When the Jews started coming back in the city, the Gentiles tried to make the Jews follow their way of doing things. But the Jews thought their way was better. Two sides that each thought their side was better; this was a recipe for disaster. Paul spends the better part of the book of Romans trying to unite the Jews and the Gentiles. Showing them that their unity belonged to Christ. It was through Jesus Christ that they received all the blessings of salvation, baptism, and so many other things. In chapter eight, Paul is telling them of the unity they have with Christ and the Holy Spirit and then gets to our verse for the day. "If God is for us, who can be against us?"

The Roman church had wasted so much time arguing and debating that they were letting themselves fall apart. And Paul reminds them that they all have God on their side. They stand united in God! I wonder how many of us will let little fights and arguments snow ball into huge disasters. We let little things get in the way of having relationships with the people we care about most. We are to be united in Jesus Christ! And if we have Christ on our side, who can tear us apart?

If we are living the way Christ wants us to live, we will be demonstrating the love, compassion, mercy, grace, kindness, patience and many other virtues that Christ demonstrated during His time on earth. If we apply those things to our lives, the arguments and disagreements seem so pathetic. Paul was trying to tell the Romans that there was much more to being a Christian than getting your way. Being a Christian is not about people seeing **your** way, or **you** being right, but it's about Jesus Christ. It's about taking a stand for Jesus. It's about having God on your side. Being a Christian is about serving our Lord every day. It's about loving others the way Christ loved us. It's about seeking and saving the lost.

When God is with us, the hard times seem possible to conquer. When God is with us, it's easier to forgive the people who have done wrong to us. When God is with us, the small arguments and disagreements don't really matter. When God is with us, the Devil cannot stand against us. God will always deliver us from temptations and sin. God will always forgive us of our wrongs. God will always love us. God will always make sure His children are provided for. God will always have a home prepared for us.

Take a moment today to thank God for being on our side. The real question is; are we on His side? Try to take a stand for God today. Go out of your way to share the Gospel with someone. Remember that with God on our side, no one can stand against us!
