His wife, in a huffy tone, then rebuked him saying, “Well!! A lot of good worship does you!”

Today, as we prepare to attend a worship service, what are you looking at? Who are you focused on? Why are you there?

When John received the Revelation on Patmos he was enthralled. It was an incredible, amazing, breathtaking panorama of events that the angelic messenger unfolded before his eyes. We can understand how John might in the excitement of the moment fall down to worship the angel.

But the heavenly host said, “Do not do it! I am a fellow servant with you and with your brothers who hold to the testimony of Jesus.” Then he admonished the apostle with a simple two-word command: “Worship God!” (Rev. 19:10)

Daily Spark #34

Acts 5:41 "So they departed from the presence of the council, rejoicing that they were counted worthy to suffer shame for His name."

Our verse today comes at the tail end of one of my favorite stories. The apostles had been preaching and teaching the name of Jesus Christ in Jerusalem. They had been imprisoned, released by the angel of the Lord, and told to go teach at the temple. The apostles were captured again and put on trial. After the council decided to let the apostles go and see if this "Christian movement" would die out on it's own, they beat the apostles and sent them on their way. And now for the unusual part. After the apostles were beaten and told not to speak the name of Christ anymore, they left the presence of the council and started rejoicing that they were worthy enough to suffer for the name of Christ. Did we read that right? They were actually thankful that they were able to suffer for taking a stand for Jesus Christ? I don't know if I would have been able to have the same thankful attitude after I had just been in prison and beaten.

What persecutions have you faced lately? The apostles faced persecutions on what seems like a daily basis. But yet they always found the strength to keep going. I think a lot of it has to do with their attitude. They were thankful for the opportunity to serve the Lord. They were thankful for the opportunity to suffer in the name of Christ. They were thankful for message that they were trying to deliver. Can we say that we have the same attitude? When someone hurls an insult at you because you believe in Jesus Christ, is your response, "thank you?" Do you thank someone when they ridicule you, mock you, make fun of you, gossip about you, and emotionally and spiritually cut you down? It is only natural for our first reaction to be defensive, to feel hurt, and to get angry. But the apostles took it all in stride. They counted themselves worthy to suffer shame for the name of Christ.

Think for a moment today, as you are sitting with your friends and family, about how good we have it here; think about the blessing we really have. I've mentioned it earlier this week, but we don't have to fear the government bashing our door in and physically harming us because we believe in Jesus. But yet we still find it hard to take our stand for Jesus. The apostles feared for their lives everyday, but their attitude kept them strong.

I can only answer this question for myself (and I know the answer is yes), but "Do you need an attitude adjustment?" Today as you are thanking God for all the blessings He's given you this past year, reflect for a moment on your own attitude towards God. Are you thankful that He chose you? Are you thankful that He wants you with Him? Are you thankful for the opportunity you have to take a stand for Him? Are you thankful for the opportunity to teach other people about Him? People will reject us. People will make fun of us. People will call us "stupid" for believing in something that has never been "proven." But that should only make us stronger. When Jesus suffered, He didn't let it keep him down. He endured and He came back stronger.

"Thank you Lord for the opportunity to suffer shame for your name. Keep me strong in the faith. Show me Your way. Help me to stand firm in the times of trouble."
