 ~ 1 Thessalonians 3:9



Daily Spark #3

Genesis 39:2 “The Lord was with Joseph, and he was a successful man; and he was in the house of his master the Egyptian.”

The story of Joseph is my personal favorite. If anyone has a reason to complain because of how their life was going, it’s Joseph. Hated and despised by his own brothers. There were times I gave my brother a good beating, but I’ve never wanted to sell him into slavery. Joseph was sold and eventually became a slave to an Egyptian, put in command over all of his house, was wrongfully accused of wanting to sleep with the Egyptian’s wife, so he was thrown in jail. Joseph was quickly put in command of the jail, but was forgotten by Pharaoh’s servant for two years. Joseph found himself on a roller coaster ride. It seemed like his whole life was just a huge series of ups and downs.

Can we relate? Sometimes it seems like life is great. We don’t have a care in the world, but then it takes one situation to make all that come crashing down. You lose your job, lose a friend or family member, become sick, get bad test results from the doctor. All of those things can really put a damper on life. I try to think of how Joseph handled everything that happened to him. How was he able to overcome it? What made him so strong and so courageous?

I think Joseph knew that no matter how bad things got, no matter how hard his life would get, he knew that God was always with him. And because of that, God made him a successful man. Every time life threw Joseph down to the floor, God picked him right back up. God made Joseph more successful than he could ever imagine.

Today, the world defines success by how many sports championships you’ve won, or how many movies you’ve made, how many millions of dollars you have, or how pretty and good looking you are. Do you think God measures success the same way? It’s easy to look at the world around us and wonder why we can’t have the fame and fortune that other people have. Success isn’t defined with how much money is in your bank account or how good you look, success is where you are in your standing with Jesus.

If we live our lives the way God wants us to and we devote ourselves to him, we will have more riches than we can ever imagine. Not physical riches, but the riches of eternal life in heaven. Joseph knew that God would take care of him. Do we trust that God will take care of us? The Lord stayed with Joseph during his whole roller coaster ride and the Lord is with you too. A day is coming where it won’t matter who won the most sports championships or who has the most awards. Those things will all be left behind. The only thing that matters is if *you’ve* stuck with the Lord.

Open your eyes and see how successful you really are. Do you have family that loves you? A house to go home to? A job that pays? Friends that care for you? If you have even one of those things, you are blessed more than you will ever know. And even if you don’t have any of those things, you have a God that loves you and wants you to be with Him. And He will never leave you. That’s greater than any success here in this world.
