Where did the light come from?

- God saying "Let there be light" in verse 3 precedes the creation of celestial bodies.
- Regardless of what we might believe about the timing and how to interpret chronology in Genesis 1, there remains a theological point.
- The light of Genesis 1:3 comes before the sun, moon, and stars, so where does it come from?

Where did the light come from?

- The only answer that makes any sense is this: this light is the radiating glory of God.
- It was God's glory that first illumined creation.

- And the city has no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God gives it light, and its lamp is the Lamb. (Revelation 21:23)
- And night will be no more. They will need no light of lamp or sun, for the Lord God will be their light, and they will reign forever and ever. (Revelation 22:5)
- Just as God's light was before the rest of creation, so God's glory will shine after it is gone.

• This is the message that we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light, and in him is no darkness at all. (1 John 1:5)
