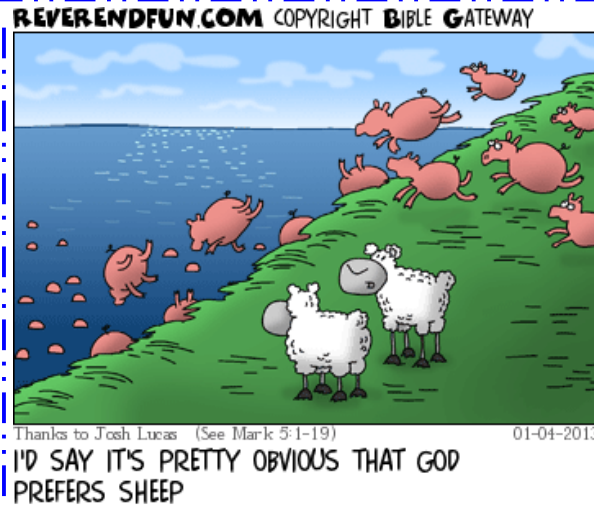

It's time we start placing the value on God's people that they deserve. It's time we start searching for the people that need the help and love of Jesus Christ. It's time we start saving the world from the devil. God obviously thought that you were worth the trouble of sending His Son to die for our sins.

It's time you take out your Bible and start searching for treasure. When you find something as valuable as a soul, it's worth the search.

### Daily Spark #22

*Exodus 20:14 "You shall not commit adultery."*

As we continue our study of the Ten Commandments, we come to the seventh: "You shall not commit adultery." Since it has to do with a sexual sin, many people tend to shy away from it. Or many people will say that adultery has never been in issue in their lives so they don't really need to worry about this one. Or some of you may be thinking that since you're not married, then this command doesn't apply to you. Technically adultery does mean to have sexual relations with someone other than your spouse, but was God just telling His people to not commit adultery? Actually, I think this command goes much deeper than that, and it actually applies to anyone who calls themselves a Christian whether they are married or not.

This commandment is talking about sexual purity. I would suggest not only in the marriage, but also in every aspect of our lives. Is God only telling those who are married to be pure? I highly doubt it. The Old and New Testaments both tell us to keep ourselves pure, not just sexually, but physically, emotionally and spiritually as well. Purity is a rare thing in this world today. The world suggests that drugs and alcohol are the norm. Sexual relations before marriage is totally acceptable. Cussing, gossip, and slander are expected if you want to be accepted in a group. Being pure goes so much deeper than just sexually.

We need to be pure in what we say. Our tongue is probably the hardest thing to control. It's easy to let bad words slip, start talking about someone else's business, tell a joke that probably shouldn't be told, or talk bad about someone behind their back. Jesus wants us to have pure tongues and pure language. The same tongue we use to cuss, lie, and gossip with is the same tongue we praise our Lord with. How are you using your tongue?

We need to be pure in where we go. People can tell a lot about us by the places we go. If your friends or coworkers are going to get some drinks after work and you decide to go with them, we are suggesting to them that Christians can partake of that behavior. Christ called us to be different. There are certain places Christians shouldn't be going and by going these places, we see and experience certain things that could make our eyes and our minds impure.

We need to be pure in what we do. Our actions need to show people that we are trying to be more like Christ. How can we have pure actions? We can forgive people even when they won't forgive us. We can show love and compassion on the people who don't deserve it. We can help those who are in need. We can live every day like heaven is coming tomorrow.

We can be pure in so many ways besides sexually. And let's face it, we have all messed up. I know I have. None of us are perfect. We all say things we shouldn't say. We've all been to a place we probably shouldn't have gone. We have all done things we are not proud of. But God will always forgive us. God will always give us an opportunity to become pure again. If you think that you haven't been pure like Christ wants you to be, ask God for forgiveness. Ask Him to make you pure and holy again.

Strive today to be more pure sexually, physically, emotionally, and spiritually. God will help you.
